Safety Drills

This week our students and staff practiced all three of our safety drills (fire, severe weather, and lockdown). Staff had shared with students that we would be practicing and taught them the procedures for each one ahead of time. Students did a great job! For the fire drill, all students were out of the building in less than 2 minutes, and all classes were checked in and adults accounted for in about 4 ½ minutes. We will practice all of these drills multiple times this year. Our next round will be in October, with the fire department and police department coming in to give us feedback on our procedures.

Pre-Arranged Absence Forms

Absences (other than sick days or doctor appointments) during the school year are considered UNEXCUSED unless a pre-arranged absence form is completed. This form allows students to make-up homework missed during the absence. Forms must be received at least two school days prior to the absence. Prearranged (Excused) absences shall be limited to five per year.
